David M. Rubenstein, 55, is a co-founder and Managing Director of The Carlyle Group, a private equity firm based in Washington, D.C.

The Carlyle Group is one of the world's largest private equity firms, managing more than \$20 billion through twenty-five private equity funds from twenty-four offices in the U.S., Europe, Asia and Japan.

Prior to co-founding Carlyle in 1987, Mr. Rubenstein practiced law in New York,

with the firm of Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison; served as Deputy Assistant to the President for Domestic Policy in the Carter Administration; and practiced law in Washington, D.C., with the firm of Shaw, Pittman, Potts & Trowbridge.

Mr. Rubenstein is a magna cum laude graduate of Duke University, where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, and a graduate of the University of Chicago Law School, where he was an editor of the Law Review.

Mr. Rubenstein is a member of the Trilateral Commission and the Council of Foreign Relations; the Board of Directors of the International Institute of Economics and the Center for Strategic and International Studies; the Board of Trustees of Johns Hopkins University, Duke University, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and the Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts; the Visiting Committee of the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard; and the National Advisory Board of J.P. Morgan Chase.

Mr. Rubenstein is married to Alice Rogoff Rubenstein, and they have three children.
